



# Local Update

### **Fantastic Garden Party**

The Hospice of St Francis will hold its popular annual Garden Party in the stunning grounds of Ashridge House on Sunday 14th September, with this year's event offering a wide range of activities and attractions to keep the whole family entertained.

Party-goers can look forward to regular attractions like cream teas, live music, a dog show, Pimms tent and a wide range of speciality, locally produced food and drink. There will also be a Shop Local Village with a variety of artisan gifts to browse.

The family-friendly event draws crowds in the thousands who come to soak up the festival atmosphere and enjoy the opportunity to explore the extensive grounds of Ashridge House, which has played host for 21 years to what is now the best-attended event in the charity's fundraising calendar.

Nearly 5,000 people made the most of the warm

sunshine last year, raising over £43,000 for the Berkhamsted-based charity.

The Garden Party is a chance to show support for the Hospice and help to raise the over £6m needed every year to fund its free care and support for people facing life-limiting illnesses in West Herts and South Bucks.

Live music from Choir on the Green, The James Trio, and a ukelele band will entertain the crowds throughout the afternoon. Children can look forward to circus skills, face painting, and craft activities like sand art.

Patient Satisfaction Improves

A ccording to the results of a national survey, patient satisfaction with GP practices, NHS dental and pharmacy services has improved across Hertfordshire.

The survey, which was sent out to just over 14,000 local patients earlier this year, revealed:

- 75% of patients expressed overall satisfaction with their GP practice, compared with 72% last year
- 91% of patients expressed overall satisfaction with local pharmacy services, compared with 89% last year
- 7% of patients expressed overall satisfaction with local NHS dental services, compared with 75% last year



Avni Shah, Director of Primary Care, NHS Hertfordshire and West Essex Integrated Care Board, (ICB) said: "This is great news and it's fantastic that all three services, GP, dental and pharmacy have achieved these results.

"This patient feedback shows that our local services remain resilient, and staff continue to work hard to do all they can for patients, despite the continuing pressure on NHS services.

"We do know however that people's experiences differ across the patch which is why our focus continues to be on enhancing local services, working with and supporting individual services where needed, and implementing further change for the better."

Over the last year the ICB's primary care team has worked with local GP, dentist and pharmacy services to improve access to services and patient experience.

This includes investing in advanced telephone systems and expanding the use of online consultation tools to make it easier for patients



to contact their GP practice. The local NHS has also promoted the NHS app which has led to an over 50% increase in patients registering with the app an 40% increase in patients using it to order repeat prescriptions\*. This year has also seen the expansion and development of the Pharmacy First scheme with pharmacies making it easier to get help for common conditions. There have been over 150,000 consultations in pharmacies that might previously have been delivered in general practice.

There have also been 120,000 new patients seen by an NHS dentist\* and more appointments available including through the urgent dental care service.








## Encouraging Children

When it comes to drama and performing arts in general, it seems likely that there are many benefits for children. Involvement in drama activities can help children to develop essential life skills that extend beyond the stage, enhancing their academic performance, social interactions, and their emotional wellbeing. Also, drama can encourage children to step outside their comfort zones and explore different characters and scenarios, sparking their imagination and creativity.

We spoke to Katie Hillcoat, who opened her own performing arts school in 2015 and launched in Harpenden in January this year, and she told us what it's all about.

Katie began as a Performing Arts teacher for Jigsaw Arts in 2012. By 2014 she became a school manager and then she opened her own Jigsaw Arts school in 2015. Starting with just 30 students, her classes grew so quickly that she opened another school in 2017, a third in 2019 and now has Harpenden too, with a total of 550 students across the schools.

Katie told us: "I moved to Harpenden when my eldest was 4 months old and knew instantly I wanted to bring Jigsaw into the local community as there is nothing quite like it! He is now 4 years

old and I have a 3-year-old and an 11-month-old. I decided to go for it in January and we opened in Harpenden with over 50 fantastic students aged 3-18 years."

Even though many people dream of becoming stars of stage and screen, there is clearly lots of work involved and we were keen to find out just how it all began for Katie and she explained: "I've been performing for as long as I can remember! I grew up in the Lake District and moved to Liverpool when I was 18 to train at Paul McCartney's Liverpool Institute for Performing Arts and The National Youth Theatre of Great Britain. I then moved to Germany after graduating, to tour in a musical and two plays. When I moved back to the UK I took part in various theatre projects and quickly fell in love with teaching the Performing Arts and how rewarding it was to see my students gain so much confidence! I knew this was the right path for me and have never looked back."

Performing Arts classes at Jigsaw are a mixture of singing, dance and drama. Every class is full of energy and imagination and can include all things musical theatre/Broadway, as well as the commercial elements of street dance, pop and acting for screen.

Each session is a chance for the children to grow in confidence, make friends, and explore their creative spark in a structured and supportive environment. Children are encouraged to explore their imaginations, build confidence, and grow. All staff team members are DBS checked and have attended the rigorous Jigsaw Arts teacher training. The team have all trained at London's top drama schools such as Laine Theatre Arts & Mountview in professional Musical Theatre. They have very successful careers within the Performing Arts industry which is very exciting for our students!

Sessions are on Sunday mornings at Katherine Warington School. There are parent/child classes for tots up to aged 3 and there are 'drop off' classes which are a mixture of singing, dance and drama for 3-4's and 5-6's, which are 90 minutes of singing, dance and drama. 7-18's attend from 10am - 1pm and rotate between an hour of singing, dance and drama each week. Katie told us: "We work towards exciting end of term class shows and presentations so parents and family can come along to see what we have been working on in our singing, dance and



drama."

The great thing is that Jigsaw Arts offers a two-week trial initially, so you and your child can see if it works for you before you commit to a full term. Classes begin again with a new term starting on Sunday 21st September, so now is a good time to book a trial. See page 19 for contact

# All About Shingles

Shingles can occur anywhere on your body and is a viral infection that causes a painful rash. It typically looks like a single stripe of blisters that wraps around the left side or the right side of your torso.

Shingles is caused by the varicella-zoster virus - the same virus that causes chickenpox. After you've had chickenpox, the virus stays in your body for the rest of your life. Years later, the virus may reactivate as shingles.

Shingles isn't life-threatening, but it can be very painful and unpleasant. Vaccines can help lower the risk of shingles. Early treatment may shorten a shingles infection and lessen the chance of complications. The most common complication is postherpetic neuralgia. This is a painful condition that causes shingles pain for a long time after your blisters have cleared.

### Causes of shingles

You cannot get shingles from someone with shingles or chickenpox but you can get chickenpox from someone with shingles if you have not had chickenpox before. When people get chickenpox, the virus stays in the body. It can be reactivated later and cause shingles if someone's immune system is weakened. This can be because of stress, certain conditions, or treatments like chemotherapy.



### **Symptoms of shingles**

Shingles symptoms usually affect only a small section on one side of your body and the first signs of shingles can be:

- Pain, burning or tingling
- Sensitivity to touch
- A red rash that begins a few days after the pain
- Fluid-filled blisters that break open and crust over
- Itching

### Some people also experience:

- Fever
- Headache
- Sensitivity to light
- Fatigue

Pain is usually the first symptom of shingles. For some people, the pain can be intense. Depending on the location of the pain, it can sometimes be mistaken for problems with the heart, lungs or kidneys. Some people experience shingles pain without ever developing the rash.

The rash appears as blotches on your skin, on 1 side of your body only. A rash on both the left and right of your body is unlikely to be shingles. The blotches become itchy blisters that ooze fluid. A few days later, the blisters dry out and scab. Whilst the shingles rash often develops as a stripe of blisters that wraps around either the left or right side of the torso, sometimes the rash can

occur around one eye or on one side of the neck or face.

### **Treatment for shingles**

Treatment for shingles depends on how severe your symptoms are and whether you're at risk of complications. If you have a mild rash you may not need any treatment.

You may be offered medicine (antiviral tablets) to help speed up your recovery from shingles if: you have a weakened immune system, your pain or your rash is moderate or severe, the rash is affecting other areas of your body apart from your chest, tummy and back.

You usually need to start taking the medicine within 3 days of your rash first appearing. Treatment for shingles can also include medicines to help relieve pain, such as painkillers, steroid tablets or medicines that help with nerve pain.

### Looking after yourself

If you have shingles there are things you can do to help with the symptoms such as keeping the rash clean and dry to reduce the risk of infection, wearing loose-fitting clothing, using a cool compress (a bag of ice cubes or frozen vegetables wrapped in a towel, or a wet cloth) a few times a day and taking paracetamol to ease pain.

It can take up to 4 weeks for the shingles rash to heal. Your skin can be

painful for weeks after the rash has gone, but it usually gets better over time.

### Is it contagious?

As previously noted, you can't spread shingles to others but people could catch chickenpox from you if they have not had chickenpox before or have not had the chickenpox vaccine because shingles is caused by the chickenpox virus. So try to avoid any one that hasn't had chicken pox before as well as anyone that is pregnant or babies under 1 month old. You can only spread the infection to other people while the rash is weeping.

### **Complications of shingles**

Most people recover from shingles without any problems. But it can sometimes cause complications, such as: post-herpetic neuralgia, where pain lasts for several months after the shingles rash has gone. The rash becomes infected, which may need to be treated with antibiotics. Scarring or changes in skin colour after the rash has healed, muscle weakness and eye problems may occur.

Another complication is Ramsay Hunt syndrome, which is a rare condition where shingles affects your facial nerve, causing weakness on one side of your face, and sometimes hearing problems. You can reduce the risk of complications by getting treatment as soon as possible after your symptoms start.



### Shingles vaccine

A shingles vaccine is available on the NHS for:

- people who turned 65 on or after 1 September 2023
- people aged 70 to 79 who have not yet been vaccinated
- people aged 50 and over with a severely weakened immune system



The vaccine helps reduce your risk of getting shingles and even if you get shingles after being vaccinated, the symptoms can be much milder. You can get shingles more than once, so it's important to get vaccinated even if you've had shingles before.

Ask your GP surgery if you can get the vaccine on the NHS.

# Protect Your Family Against Measles

As measles cases continue to rise across the country, parents, guardians and carers are being urged to make sure their children are up to date with their Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) vaccinations. The MMR vaccine is the most effective way to protect children from becoming extremely unwell as a result of these highly contagious diseases. Two doses of the vaccine are needed to give a child lifetime protection.

Measles spreads easily among unvaccinated people, especially in nurseries and schools - so far in 2025 there have been more than 500 confirmed cases in England, with most of these being young children. You can catch it just by spending time in the same room as someone who has it, even if they don't know they are infected. Children who get measles are often really unwell, and it can lead to serious health conditions such as meningitis and hearing loss. In extreme cases, as we have recently seen elsewhere in the country, it can even be fatal.

### How to get the MMR vaccine

### Residents' Feedback
